About the sessions

Opening Keynote: Age of Discovery

The symposium will open with a session from Dr Chris Kutarna, author of the international bestseller *Age of Discovery*, who will discuss the principles of exploration, adaptability, and courage to guide and inspire participants as we navigate the uncertainties in a rapidly evolving world.

Panel discussion: Future of Work – Trends and Predictions

This session aims to delve into the complex and evolving landscape of work in the coming years, highlighting the key obstacles, barriers, and opportunities that individuals and organizations are likely to face. Our panel of experts will discuss the key issues that we need to address to support future generations to thrive in increasingly mobile and digital societies; explore the dynamic landscape of work in the upcoming years, delving into the shifts, key trends and predictions shaping the future of work, along with strategies to navigate the evolving landscape successfully.

Panel discussion: Unleashing Entrepreneurial Potential: Navigating Opportunities and Overcoming Challenges

This session will explore the unique opportunities available to entrepreneurs today and the essential skills and strategies required to seize them. Panellists will identify emerging trends and opportunities in various sectors, discuss the essential skills, mindsets, and resources needed to thrive in today's competitive landscape and share success stories and lessons learned from alumni who have successfully navigated their entrepreneurial journeys.

Panel discussion: Amplifying Impact: Leveraging Alumni Networks for Personal and Institutional Advancement

Alumni networks serve as a vital resource for personal and professional growth. This session will focus on how alumni can cultivate stronger connections within their communities, leverage in-country activities, and ultimately enhance their own trajectories while raising the status of their alma mater. The session will aim to explore the critical role of alumni networks in personal development and career progression, identify strategies for alumni to engage in meaningful in-country activities that foster collaboration and growth and discuss how individual alumni efforts can collectively elevate the reputation and visibility of their institution.

Adaptability and Resilience

This session will be delivered by Rob Lilwall, NatGeo TV Adventurer. We will hear about Rob's exciting, stories of adventure – such as surviving at -40, getting lost in jungles, and pedalling across Afghanistan. Grounded in the models of *The Resilient Agility Meter* and *The Eight Spokes of Resilient Agility* Rob weaves in powerful reflections about the mindset shifts and behavioural change he has nurtured in order to thrive amid the fear, the uncertainty and the opportunity which he has faced. These mindsets and changes involve embracing challenge, understanding fear, practicing self-care and having a collaborative mindset – all highly relevant for today's fast changing and unpredictable business environment. For beyond our IQ, qualifications and experience, it is having the right mindsets that can make all the difference.
